Greetings YBA family,

Somewhere along the way I started repeating a phrase I heard as a funny quip or response. If someone asked me a question which involves numbers and/or mathematics, I would reply, *"I was told there would be no math involved today."* (This quote actually originated from a sketch with Chevy Chase on Saturday Night Live in 1976.) Today, as Christ followers we are asked our opinion on a lot of things and we may want to respond, *"I was told there would be no math"* as a way to not respond or inadvertently admitting that maybe we really don't have a clue or don't want to answer. But as 1 Peter 3:15 instructs us, we must be ready to give an answer.

I want to share with you briefly today about the math of the Gospel message. The Bible talks a lot about math. Now I'm not talking about some numerology study that is going to predict the end of times, but I am talking about the importance of mathematical terminology in the Bible. Terms like addition, subtraction, multiplication and even division.

Acts 2:46-47 tells us that the Lord added to their number day by day those who were being saved.

We are told not to add or subtract anything from God's word in Deuteronomy 4:2. In the beginning God told Adam and Eve to **be fruitful and multiply**. In fact, the word "Multiply" occurs over 23 times just in the book of Genesis. The word "divided" or "division" occurs over 175 times in the Bible including the verse in Mark 3:24 "*If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand.*"

The year 2020 will be remembered here in America as the year of COVID-19 and a year of focus on Social Justice, especially when it relates to the injustice of racism committed against our African American citizens. We the church must be ready to give an answer that adds up. A few weeks ago, a friend of mine, Nate Jones, published an article in the Biblical Recorder where he made the following statement:

"It is not enough to simply say, "I don't condone racism or participate in racism." We must do what we can to be part of the solution. Scripture tells us in 1 John 4 that God loved us and we ought to love others. In fact, if we don't love others, then the love of God is not in us." We must be willing to add, subtract, multiply and divide in ways that will honor God.

I wholeheartedly agree with Nate and others who are calling us as the church to stand up against racism. Black Lives Matter! Yes, I said it! Now many of us will want to respond, but All Lives Matter to God and while we are correct, we are missing the point entirely. If four of us were in a car wreck and three of us had minor scratches and bruises while one person was seriously injured, I doubt that we would fight over who needed the paramedic's attention first.

We must prayerfully ask God to help us to treat each person, made in the image of God, with respect and learn to love one another as Christ loves us. Last week I listened to a panel discussion hosted online by Ronnie Floyd, president and CEO of the SBC Executive Committee, who brought together five African American Southern Baptist pastors and leaders. The panel discussion was honest and painful to hear but as Christ followers, we must all listen and learn.

Philadelphia pastor K. Marshall Williams urged Southern Baptists to stand together in unity against injustice, stating that, "unless hearts change, nothing will change in America."

Affirming Southern Baptists' strong, passionate stands against things like abortion and sexual immorality, Pastor Williams charged Baptists "to be as passionate about racism and injustice, because it's part of the biblical mandate, Micah 6:8, to do justice."

"I don't think we need to write any more resolutions." he said. "We need to put some shoe leather in it and effect some change. ... Our younger generation wants to see practical application of the biblical principle."

May we practice the Gospel math of adding new friends from other races, cultures, subtracting our bias and hate, and multiplying Agape love to all people. And may the church not be divided but more united than ever as we move forward. I look forward to seeing how God can use your church and YBA to truly reflect His glory to the Triangle and the ends of the earth. I pray that John 17:21 will become a reality; "May they all be one, as You. Father, are in Me, and I am in You. May they also be in Us, so that the world may believe You sent Me."
