Let me take you down memory lane. I remember as a junior in high school that my track coach asked me to consider running high hurdles. Now back when I was in high school, the high hurdles were nearly 40 inches high. If you haven't met me, let me just say that I used to be, on a good day... maybe somewhere close to 5 foot nine inches tall. If you also know anything about track, most athletes who run high hurdles are over 6 foot tall and have long lanky legs. Once

again, I have short, stubby legs, but for some reason my coach imagined that I

could do it.

I remember on many attempts, trying and continuously, knocking down the hurdles and falling on to the grass and sometimes on to the asphalt. I remember my knees bleeding and thinking, "this is crazy." I was really frustrated and wanted to tell the coach that this was a bad idea. The coach continued to encourage me and he talked to me about adjusting my stride and stretching to increase the



height that I would lift my leg. Somewhat slowly but surely, I began to get better. I was overjoyed that I didn't knock down all the hurdles. Then, I actually came in third in a race. A few weeks later, I came in second, and just before the season ended, I won some races. I don't share this to tell you that I was a great Track Star, because I wasn't. But I have learned that in life we all have to make adjustments, and if we are careful and intentional in our adjustments, we can achieve things tomorrow that we cannot achieve today.

A few years ago we began to pray and dream about the future of Yates Baptist Association. Through that process, a Restart team was formed. We focused on our vision and purpose as a network of like-minded churches. We prayed and conducted numerous discussions about our statement of faith and what we believed. We looked at the past range and scope of the association, as well as dreamed at what the future could look like. We made some difficult but necessary decisions about our personnel, and began to consider our use of the Lakewood property where our offices are located. We have made a number of strides in the past couple years. Our giving last year was the highest it has been in nearly a dozen years. (We are closing the gap of our deficit.) We are starting to see new partnerships between churches to mutually impact their communities. Instead of seeing each other as competitors, they are seeing each other as co-laborers and teammates.

Our new vision statement says, "Our vision is to see the Great Commission fulfilled through sacrificial collaboration." Our new mission statement says, "We collaborate to strengthen, plant, and resource churches in order to glorify God through making disciples of all nations."

Upcoming Ministry Opportunity

Plans to Restart the Yates Baptist Association Orange Correctional Prison Ministry in Summer of 2023

WHEN: One Sunday evening per month for 5 months beginning around June 2023. Times/date are not set.

WHERE: Services held in the Peace Center. Same location where we met previously at the Orange County Correctional, Hillsborough.

WHO: Each Sunday evening a group of 10 "One-Time Volunteers" will be admitted to enter. A One-Time Volunteer Form (DC 345) will be processed by each volunteer when you arrive at the facility. A valid, current picture ID must be presented by each volunteer.

All volunteers must be 18 years of age or older.

A list of all volunteer names will be submitted to Chaplain Leroy prior to the visit date. IMPORTANT: Persons from our churches who are victims of crimes (or family members of victims) committed by inmates at Orange Correctional should not be volunteers. Persons that have other personal relationships with any inmate should not be a volunteer.

WHAT: We envision a service of Praise/Worship/Music followed by a Fellowship Time. Chaplain Leroy says snacks are permitted. They must be packed in transparent containers. Finger foods: brownies, cookies, etc. are good. No cans allowed, but sodas in plastic bottles are permitted. No metal silverware. We will check about plastic utensils/plates.

Logistics: We will seek commitments from at least 3 churches that will have 10 volunteers. For the other 2 Sundays, we will combine churches to establish a Ministry Team of 10 volunteers.

Ministry Teams of less than 10 volunteers may be possible, but we desire 10. If 3 churches cannot assemble 10 volunteers, then we will use whatever combinations that give us a 10-volunteer Ministry Team. As we move forward, we will seek to involve as many YBA churches as possible.

Churches interested in serving will contact Frank Shipp or Marty Childers. They will establish and schedule the ministry teams.

We will begin informing/educating YBA churches in February. By mid-April 2023, we hope to have our first Ministry Teams in place.

OTHER CONSIDERATIONS:

Moving forward, efforts will be made to offer formal training (Blue Card, Orange Card) to volunteers that desire more involvement. Orange Card certification allows the volunteer to take inmates off site for church/community activities.

• Chaplain Josh Leroy is available to fill the pulpit on fairly short notice or advance notice. If a church invites him to come speak, if possible, plan his visit ahead of time and let the church members know there will be a Prison Ministry emphasis.

We will be considering other ways that YBA can assist in funding this important Chaplain Ministry at Orange Correctional. NO PUBLIC funds support this position.

Please determine your churches willingness to participate in this new Orange Correctional Prison Ministry. Please let Frank Shipp or Marty Childers know when you are ready to commit and how many volunteers will be on your team.

Please BE AWARE: Because of concerns for the safety of our volunteers and the security of the facility, Orange County Correctional policies regarding volunteers is SUBJECT TO CHANGE AT ANYTIME. We will proceed with our plans understanding that adjustments may be necessary. ALSO: A return to a ministry "the way it used to be" is not possible given the changes in the facility and the impacts of COVID-19.

Some questions you or others may ask... Is Oaxaca safe? Short answer is YES! The long answer is Oaxaca is a world tourist destination because of its food, history, and culture. Tourists are welcomed and security is meant to protect you. There is no visible drug cartel activity in southern Mexico. Oaxaca is the name of the state and city. (Just like New York, New York). Oaxaca City is a major city with a small-town feel.

What are the group rules? Great question!

- 1. Don't be unwise or cause others to be unwise.
- 2. If there is a decision to be made, choose the option that is best for our group and not just for you.
- 3. Whining is not the way it makes you look bad and annoys those around you.
- 4. Don't say anything about anyone that you have not said to them.
- Wear clothes that impress God, not girls or guys. (Raise your hands and touch your toes and if anything shows, then change your clothes.)
- 6. Whenever you are told to do something with your phone (turn off, turn it in, whatever) do it with a good attitude.
- 7. Alcohol and tobacco are not allowed on this trip. Don't even think about it.

Who can go?

This project is for students completing grades 9-12 and their parents.
All participants must a have a passport that does not expire before February 9, 2024.

Where are we staying? The group will be staying together at a local hotel. We are currently negotiating a contract and we will update you when a decision is made. Each student will have a safe and secure place to sleep. Hot water and WIFI are always a mystery in southern Mexico. We plan to have hot water and WIFI available. But it probably will not work like yours does at home.

Who is supervising the group? Each church is required to have one chaperon per five students. Adults/parents will be at the same hotel as students. And, interpreters will be at the hotel as well. There is an excellent amount of supervision.

What are we eating? Oaxaca is a world class food destination with an abundance of Mexican food options. Even though we do not recommend it, there's also McDonald's, Papa John's, and Subway. There's plenty to eat. AND, we will have snacks (healthy and unhealthy) available at the hotel at all times. Nobody will lose weight on this trip. What about health care? Each student and adult will be provided with Travel Health Insurance that will reimburse any emergency expense of about \$100. There are excellent healthcare options in Oaxaca. Usually, there are a few who have some stomach issues and those are taken care of quickly with rest and medicine. We hope that a nurse or two will be going with us on this trip.

What about permission to travel? Students who are not traveling with BOTH parents will need a signed affidavit from the parent NOT going that the student has permission to travel. This form will be provided to you by YBA.

WHAT TO BRING!

- Your passport that does not expire before February 9, 2024.
- You are allowed ONE suitcase and one carry on piece of luggage.
- Your own personal water bottle. Most trip illness comes from lack of hydration. DRINK LOTS OF WATER! We will provide water for you!
- Your Bible, notebook, and pens.
- Money for meals while traveling through airports to/from Oaxaca. If bringing credit cards be sure to inform your bank that you are traveling to Mexico.
- At least \$100 for souvenir and fun money. You will be able to exchange dollars to pesos in Oaxaca.
- Your favorite snacks if you're a picky eater.
- Casual clothes. No shorts at ministry sites.
 Shorts are fine during free time and during training. Keep everything modest.
- A backpack to carry your stuff each day.
- Small flashlight. (Your phone may work.)
- A copy of your passport photo page in every piece of luggage and carry-on.
- Oaxaca weather is moderate. It can get chilly in the mountains of Oaxaca so bring a jacket/ sweatshirt.
- ELECTRICITY: The electricity in Oaxaca is 110 volts. You do not need a converter.
- VACCINATIONS: If you are up to date on your USA vaccinations then you are fine to travel to Mexico. Recommended but not required are Tetanus, Typhoid, and Covid.

Each student and adult will be expected to be a part of all ministry projects. The following ministry projects are being planned:

- Telling how you became a follower of Jesus.
- Prayer Walking.
- Evangelism in the Park.
- Teaching English.

What is the COST?

The cost is \$750 plus airfare. (Estimate total is \$1,550 per person.) \$750 payment covers meals, lodging, ministry expenses, interpreters, local transportation, and travel health insurance. Meals while traveling through airports to/from Oaxaca are not covered. Students will need approximately \$100 for souvenirs and fun money.

Payment schedule:

\$250 per person is due before 2/15/23.

\$750 payment is due before 4/15/23.

Balance is due 6/1/23.




