Today many pastors find themselves stuck between change and their congregation, or as the old saying goes, "stuck between a rock and hard place." One of my daily prayers is that as church members we will be faithful to support our pastors and follow their leadership as they follow the leadership of Christ, realizing that that statement implies change! In other words, don't be the rock or the hard place for your pastor.

Where is your church on the mission to reach the lost? Is change happening? And if so, what kind of change is it? I believe that the Gospel message never changes but the way we present it and the way we share this message of hope must adapt to reach the lost in a world of constant change.

And over the last month, I've been reminded several times that change is going to happen one way or another. I was reminded that we can be a part of change or we can fight it.

Sometimes we just are not on the same page. We hear one thing but think another. Do you know what I mean? There are moments when we understand what is being communicated but somehow there is a disconnect. Listen to the following story which illustrates this point. Bubba asked his daughter to pass him the newspaper. She replied, "Dad, newspapers are so outdated nowadays, here just use my iPad, it is much better." After a loud crashing noise, Bubba was heard saying, "That fly didn't stand a chance." You see Bubba needed something but his daughter thought he wanted something else. When we talk about change in our church sometimes, we hear one thing but we are missing the point. We don't need to change things just for change's sake, we need to make changes to reach the lost and disciple people to go to the ends of the earth.

According to George Barna, 1 in 5 churches may consider closing within the next 18 months. As Mark Clifton says, "we are closing churches where we need to be planting churches."

"Legacy Churches: Celebrating Adoption and Restart" is a one-day conference to assist associational mission strategists, pastors, church staff and laity in keeping existing church facilities in evangelical hands for kingdom purposes and gospel proclamation.

There will be a conversation around the need for church restarts within existing church facilities. Since most school systems are now closed to new churches utilizing their facilities as an initial starting place, there will be a presentation about the unique needs of new churches seeking a meeting place to reach new people. The day will conclude with a Q&A and a panel discussion.
