Greetings YBA Family,

We just had a great Annual Mission Celebration! In fact, it was the best meeting we have had in years! OK, yes, it was also the first we have had in person in 2 years! But if you missed it, you truly missed a great time of testimonies, worship and celebrating both who our God is,

as well as being challenged by the call to be involved in completing the Mission Task.

I want to thank Pastor Marc Francis, the staff, and members from Ridgecrest Baptist Church who hosted our meeting. They did an amazing job. Brother Al Huffman led us to the Throne of God in worship in both sessions. The music and worship experience set the tone for the entire meeting. We heard inspiring messages from Andrew Ivester, Miguel Tantas and Noel DeAsis that encouraged and challenged us greatly. We were reminded that our hope is and should always be found in Christ and that we have a responsibility to put that hope on display for others.

I shared during my report that almost exactly 40 years ago in a town called Boiling Springs. God taught me a huge lesson. I had walked on to the football team at Gardner Webb College and over a two-year span had earned a partial athletic scholarship. I loved football and was postured to be starting as defensive cornerback in my Junior year. But that October, I had 3 concussions in a two-week period. (I know some of you are probably thinking, OK, now that explains a lot). When I went to see the doctor because of severe headaches, he asked me something that I had never even considered. The doctor said, "Have you ever thought about quitting football." Now, remember we didn't know all that much about concussions back in the early 1980's, and I certainly didn't want to quit. I have never been a guitter. But after praying about it and seeking wise counsel, I believe God led me to walk away from football, and from my own dreams. It was a very difficult decision. But If I had not guit football, I probably would not have met and married my amazing wife. So, it turned out for the best!

In May of 2007 God called us to do something very clear, and it was also one of the hardest things I've ever had to do. God very clearly, over a period of several weeks using scripture and other Christian friends, made it clear that he was calling us to leave Bolivia after living there for nearly 20 years. We had raised our kids there. I had lived there longer than anywhere else in my whole life. That was a difficult decision. But God used it for His Glory.

About six years ago, God called us to resign from the International Mission Board without telling us what the next step would be, and that was really hard. But every time that God has called us away from something, He has called us to something. I am blessed to serve as your Mission Strategist for YBA, but I would not be here if I had not been willing to make a difficult decision.

Let me ask you what God might be asking you to do today? Or maybe even, what is God calling you to leave today in order to move to the next phase of your life. Make no mistake, God has called all of us as His children to be a part of the Great Commission. He is called each church and each believer to live on mission. But in order to do that, we may have to change our plans and our priorities in order to follow Christ and His plan.

I spoke with a friend of mine today who is serving in another part of the world. He shared with me that he thinks God wants him to do something new, but he is not sure what...but he said, "I don't know what is going on, but God is up to something." I reminded my friend, "Yes, God is always up to something and it almost always calls us to sacrifice and get in line with HIS plan, which in the end it is always best."


