We just celebrated our 74th Annual Yates Baptist Associational meeting. We changed the name several years ago to our Annual Mission Celebration. Honestly, it was a true celebration of what God has done, is doing, as well as a challenge to what He wants to do with us in the future. We are grateful to pastor Christopher Ingram and the good folks from Yates Baptist Church who hosted us. It was a wonderful time to worship and praise our God. The

music was great, and I am very thankful to David Driggers for leading us in worship. I have heard from many people who said it was the best Associational meeting they have been a part of in many years. I am not going to rate it, but I do agree that it was an amazing time to celebrate the Lord and our partnership in the Gospel together.

In our Book of Reports, I wrote about how 2022 is a new day for Gospel Advance. I truly believe it! I believe that we are living in the most exciting time in all of history. Never before could you get on an airplane and go almost anywhere in the world in less than 24 hours. Some of the early missionaries traveled for many months to get to the Port of entry in the country where they were going, and then it took them days or weeks to arrive at their place of service. Just in the last 30 years, reflect on how much communications have changed. When we first arrived in Bolivia in the early 90s, it would take us 20 to 30 minutes to possibly get an international line to call home. By the way, in those early years it was about five dollars a minute to talk to family. So, you can imagine we didn't have very long phone calls. Today, from anywhere in the world you can just hold an apparatus in your hand and talk to anyone in just seconds. Not only can you call them, you can see them via video. These are just a few examples of the changes in our world. But I want you to think how that affects the Gospel proclamation. More than any other time in history we have the opportunity to go and to share the Good News of salvation in Jesus Christ with a world that is dying to hear.

At our Mission Celebration, we heard challenging testimonies. Pastor Dan Johnson from Cross Culture Church shared how we need to put all of our plans and preferences on the altar of the Great Commission. Wow, what a powerful statement. He went on to tell a personal story of how God had changed his heart for the advance of the Kingdom. Stop and think about that word picture, the altar of the Great Commission. I am asking myself what I need to put on that altar. Will you do that as well? We had a concerted time of prayer for the churches and the Kingdom advance that needs to happen. We prayed for personal renewal and revival in our churches that would make a lasting difference here locally and to the ends of the earth. Our Church Strengthening Team is ready to assist you and your church in any way possible to help you take the Gospel into your community.

We heard about the new partnership between NAMB (North American Mission Board) and NC Baptists called SENDNC. These are exciting days. This partnership can allow YBA churches to plant churches and reproduce the Gospel presence here in the Triangle and beyond. This partnership is giving new hope, as well as resources to local churches. Churches who may have never considered planting a new church now have an unparalleled opportunity. Our mission statement says that we collaborate to strengthen, plant, and resource churches in order to glorify God through making disciples of all nations. That is what we desire to see happen.

We heard powerful messages from Craig Phelps, pastor of Gorman Baptist Church, and Dr. Gordon Fort, Sr. Ambassador for the President of the IMB. We were reminded that we have been called to reach those who are lost and make disciples of them. We heard that discipleship is not a program; it is a practice, and we were exhorted to put it into practice!

Just yesterday, we had a meeting with the General Secretary of the Armenian Baptist Union, Asatur Nahapetyan and Paul Langston from Baptists on Mission. We are looking at developing a long-term partnership in Armenia that can have a huge impact on all of Eastern Europe and beyond.

Pastor Rob Stone reminded us that YBA exists to "Strengthen, Plant and Resource Churches." Last year, we passed a new vision and mission statement. I'm pretty sure none of you have it memorized yet, but I do hope that in the days and weeks ahead we will live it out. Our YBA vision statement is simply to see the great commission Fulfilled through sacrificial collaboration. Now that is a vision! My guess is that when you think of Yates Baptist Association, you don't automatically think of sacrificial collaboration that leads to impact lostness, but I'm praying that that will change.

I am excited about the future of YBA. I believe that if we will see sacrificial collaboration, then we can strengthen, plant and resource the church to live on mission here in the Triangle and to the ends of the earth.

Please note requirements below:


- 1. All cookies **must be** HOMEMADE and placed in zip lock bags.
