Our days are numbered, so let's make the most of them. Let's truly seize the day for Christ our King. Let's share His-story with someone today.

One of the advantages of working with an organization like Yates Baptist Association is that I get to see the big picture of what God is doing in the churches in our area. Over the past few months, I have been encouraged by seeing Christ followers going into the community and making a difference. Making a difference in local Schools and working with First Responders. 


